DINNER & SHOW



How to Bake a Cake

SPRING CLEAN UP TIP

Since its getting warmer and we're all looking at doing some spring clean up -- what about that greasy oily cement garage floor? Well Bill Chace tried this recipe awhile back and said it really works!

If the concrete floor has become oil soaked and you want it to look new again -- Cover the floor with one thickness of newspaper. Then sprinkle over with cleaning solvent.
