At 14 I got a restricted permit so my mother could be driven to town. I drove it all through high school. The car was stored from the fall of 1956 to 1989 when a local garage nearby where I grew up in Wisconsin began its upgrade and we had to move the car out of there. So we trailored it to Alaska in the Spring of 1992. New brakes, glass, upholstery, paint and a 1950 flathead engine are some of the improvements we made. When the weather co-operates we cruise the streets of Eagle. This fall the '35 will have been a member of the family for 50 years. That calls for cake and ice cream right? Come join us!
