Ivory Jacks





"Where in the world can you find repair parts for a car like that?" that's a question people often ask about our old Willys Knight cars. Restoring our cars does take a lot of parts and finding them can be a challenge. Often the answer to "Where in the world?" is in fact "Everywhere in the world." And it involves lots of people from around the world. An example of this is the recent travels of a certain Willys Knight 70A radiator.

It started when one of our WOKR members from Australia was traveling way off up here in Alaska. They visited a small transportation museum in the village of Wasilla. Here they spotted a lonesome and neglected Willys Knight radiator and they thought perhaps some WOKR club member could use it. They sent an email to our

editor, Louise Pruitt. She in turn sent me a letter asking if I would look into it. Now Wasilla is some 350 miles South of our home in Fairbanks and the museum is run part time by a few volunteers. After several tries I did contact a person there who thought the radiator was not needed by them and would be available for a \$100 donation. So now what to do? I waited a few months until some members of our local car club were going down to Wasilla for an old car meet. One member, Loran "Squeaky" Benham, went down and paid for the radiator, he in turn gave it to another member, Roby McHone, who brought it to Fairbanks in his pick up truck.

Well now I've got this Willys Knight 70A radiator. I don't need it but some WOKR member must. So I ran an ad in the WOKR Newsletter. One of our Canadian members, Al Rich, answered the ad. Now Al lives in far northern Manitoba. In fact he lives at Thompson which is several hundred miles North of Winnipeg, Manitoba, and Winnipeg is some 3,000 miles from Fairbanks. So how to get the radiator to Al?

Again I waited until this winter when a good friend, Roger Moore, was driving a truck outside to the lower states. He hauled the radiator to Winnipeg and left it at Al's friend's repair shop, form there Al Rich could later pick it up.

Lots of miles, lots of people and yes lots of fun and friendships. Over the years WOKR members have been super helpful to me. It's only fair to repay them by helping others in return.
