CAR SHOW STAGING AND ENTRANCE by Ron Allen

Please remember: The gasoline level should be below 1/8. Each car should have a fire extinguisher. Batteries will have to be disconnected once parked inside. It would be helpful if some volunteers bring siphon hoses and empty gas tanks to help those who come unprepared. There will be drip cloths provided to place under vehicles that tend to lead oil. No gasoline leakers – Please!

Cars will be staged outside with designated rows for certain years. We need three volunteers for parking and aligning cars inside the center and two volunteers for outside staging and controlling flow of vehicles into the building. The two staging volunteers working outside will be in charge of numbering the cars in each row by year to facilitate the order they are to be driven into the Carlson Center. Two are needed as there are plenty of distractions and organizing needs in this effort. Another volunteer (or two) are needed to manage the sign-in sheets as people arrive, to instruct participants which row to park in for staging, answer questions and coordinate with other volunteers. Sign in sheets will be prepared for each row and contain columns for check-in, assigned order for entry, car year, car model, owner, designated driver and other relevant information. Having different sheets for each row will allow more room for recording information by hand. Sign-in sheets will be prepared ahead of time with expected entrants, but can be adjusted as needed at any time.

Following is the tentative line-up and entry plan for Friday evening, June 1. Cars should arrive <u>at least thirty minutes before</u> the designated entry time and preferably longer to allow time for numbering and organizing the entry order that has to take place just prior to driving in. Cars can be parked in any order within these rows. Have a driver at the car at the designated entry time. Make sure designated drivers have car keys:

| • | Row 1 | 1929 and prior | 5:00 pm |
|---|-------|----------------|---------|
| • | Row 2 | 1930 to 1945 | 5:15 |
| • | Row 3 | 1946 to 1959 | 5:30 |
| • | Row 4 | 1960 to 1969 | 5:45 |
| • | Row 5 | 1970 plus | 6:00 |

Members who anticipate difficulty having their cars signed in and located in their designated rows by the designated time should let a staging manager know ahead of time if possible.

These plans will hopefully expedite the process a bit more and avoid members from becoming a bit impatient from delays.
