# AUTO MUSEUM PLANNED FOR FAIRBANKS

It was a pleasant surprise to most members attending the November 8, general membership meeting to hear a presentation from Derik Price of Fountainhead Development Inc. (FDI) regarding their plans for construction of an auto museum next summer here in Fairbanks. I, like most of us at that meeting, probably initially looked at Derik in shock and awe wondering if our ears were playing tricks on us. Having personally visited three different car museums last summer in Wisconsin, Montana and Nevada I could hardly contain my excitement of having

one in our own hometown. The museum will be located on the Wedgewood Resort grounds off College Road.

FDI is owned by local entrepreneur, Tim Cerny. Derik is a special projects manager for FDI. FDI has already started collecting cars for the museum with a total of 19 very interesting vehicles as of our November meeting. Derik reported after the meeting that FDI had just closed a deal with a collector back east for 16 more vehicles, some of which are very rare. This brings their current total to 35 including one 1917 motorcycle. An additional item of interest is that these 35 vehicles were assembled by 28 different manufacturers, representing 21 different model years from 1898 - 1936; so FDI is really gathering a variety of styles and technology. The latest group even includes a 1901 Rochester steam carriage and an Owen Magnetic! The intent is to have a total of 40-50 drivable cars with a focus on the years 1900 to 1936. Individual cars will be driven nightly during the summer on the Wedgewood property when the weather cooperates.

The museum facility as currently envisioned will be roughly 22,000 SF including a small restoration facility, an Alaskan vehicle photo collection and space for meeting/gatherings with space for the display of 6 to 8 'theme' or specialty vehicles, portable tables with seating for several dozen people, a small kitchenette, and bathrooms. If all goes well, the museum will be open for the winter of 2008-2009.

Tim and Derik would like to meet with VLNAAC club officers to see how FDI may provide meeting space for the club and possibly a records library. Their initial thoughts were that perhaps a mutually beneficial arrangement could be developed whereby FDI could provide space and/or the use of the facility at no charge to the club, and in exchange, club members would be available during certain times as hosts, and answer questions about the collection and talk about the Vernon Nash Club.

According to FDI's website -(http://www.fdifairbanks.com/aboutFDI.html) FDI owns and manages four hotels, over half of a million square feet of commercial leasing space, and a year-round Commercial Construction Division. The hotels include Sophie Station Hotel, Wedgewood Resort, Bear Lodge and the Bridgewater Hotel. Associated operations include four restaurants, two lounges, one internet cafe & gift shop, and a convention facility. In addition to the museum plans revealed at the November 8 meeting, FDI intends to open a Wildlife Sanctuary in 2008 (http://www.fountainheadhotels.com/wedgewoo d/wildlifesanctuary/sanctuary.html) to be located behind Wedgewood Resort on newly acquired property, adjacent to the planned museum.

FDI's statement indicates they are committed to the Fairbank's community. Their plans for developing a wildlife sanctuary and an auto museum in our area firmly demonstrate the sincerity of this statement. Fairbanks is fortunate to have Tim and Fountainhead in our community, and our club is indeed privileged to be considered in their plans.

Please direct inquires and suggestions about the museum and VLNAAC's possible involvement to one of the 2008 VLNAAC board members, who can collect member's comments and ideas and present them to Tim and Derik in an organized manner. Tim and Derik do plan to join and be active in our club and to meet all of us at future VLNAAC functions. We welcome Tim and Derik to VLNAAC and look forward to developing organizational relations between FDI and

VLNAAC as well as developing personal relations between current club members and our newest members, Tim and Derik.
