We arrived at our first night stop at the historic Copper Center Lodge and picked up the other three cars in our group so we had a full compliment when we left Copper Center on Monday morning. While in Copper Center we were able to visit the local museum and a local establishment with a great display of model trains in a layout of the Kennicott mine site and the fictional town of Cicely, Alaska which was featured in the old TV show called Northern Exposure. The museum, train display and fictional town were great additions to our visit in Copper Center.

Eyak Ski Area, and just enjoying the town. Tuesday afternoon the Chamber of Commerce sponsored a car show and some of the locals brought their cars to the event. It was a great opportunity to visit with the locals and show off our cars. On Wednesday, representatives of the Chamber of Commerce and the City Council took us on a guided tour out to the Million Dollar Bridge and the Childs Glacier. Then they fed us a scrumptious lunch of grilled red salmon with all the trimmings! The drive to the glacier is about 50 miles through the Copper River Delta. We were very fortunate because the glacier decided to show off for us that day; the noise of the glacier and the calving were very exciting to listen to and watch.

There is a very nice museum in Whittier with a great display of early history, WWI and WWII, and a very nice dedication to the now late Senator Ted Stevens. The exciting part of a trip to Whittier is the drive through the two and half mile long RR tunnel. Activities in Girdwood included resting, riding to the top of Mt. Alyeska on the tram and having a fun group dinner at the Double Musky with its fine food, service and memorabilia.

The events for Friday were organized by Anchorage members Howard and Barb Hansen. We started with a tour of their terrific car collection. Next we visited the incredible Brown Family collection in Anchorage of antique trucks, cars, tractors, machinery, license plates and much more. After lunch we stopped at the Boot Hill salvage yard near Palmer. At the yard, Ron Allen and Howard Hansen "drove" the self-propelled vintage Ferris Wheel to the delight of the group. We thank the Hansens for making all of these arrangements.
