Car collecting is so popular in America that the Senate has annually proclaimed a day in July as 'Collector Car Appreciation Day'' to raise awareness of the role automotive restoration and collection plays in American society.

Whether it is the Vernon Nash Antique Automobile Club, the Midnight Sun Street Rod Association, or the Anchorage Corvette Club, it is typical of members to trade parts, knowledge, and stories. That makes for lifetime friendships.

Registering and Titling Your Antique Vehicle By William Gardner VP - Legislation

Serving in my present position on the AACA Board as VP - Legislation this past year, I have often been asked this question - What are the requirements in registering and titling my antique vehicle in my state or in another state? In addition, this question comes up frequently based on the diverse marketing methods of the buying and selling of our antique vehicles. Each respective state has their own unique set of statutes and regulations regarding this issue and there is quite a variance among the states.

A great resource to find the answers to these questions can be found in the "Tag and Title Toolbox" site located on the SEMA Action Network (SAN)website (www.semasan.com) As stated on their website, SAN is a nationwide partnership between car clubs, individual enthusiasts and members of the specialty auto parts industry who want to protect their hobby and work together to promote pro-hobby legislation. By joining SAN (at no cost or obligation), you will receive important up-dates from SEMA legislative (Specialty Equipment Market Association) via email. SEMA (www.sema.org) is a non-profit trade association composed of over 6,800 member companies including manufacturers and distributors that represent the specialty equipment automotive industry.

Upon receiving these legislative updates, you can decide if you should contact your legislators or regulators expressing support or opposition to a proposal or bill. To join SAN, please access the respective website and open the "Click here to join" section and complete the application process. SAN's efforts have resulted in positive outcomes regarding an array of issues and proposed legislation facing the antique auto hobby.

The referenced Tag and Toolbox site can be ac-Title cessed through the SAN website (www.semansan.com) by clicking on "Resources" and selecting "Titling and Registration" or through the SEMA website (www.sema.org) by clicking on "Government Affairs" and selecting "Tag and Title Toolbox." It should be noted that you do not have to join SAN to access this toolbox, but receiving the updates can be beneficial in staying current with proposed legislation.

This Toolbox site is organized by individual state (includes all 50 states) and includes the following titling and registration topics:

Regulatory language definitions

- Titling and registration information
- Applicable statutes and laws.

 Information on equipment and emission exemptions

A very beneficial aspect of this toolbox is that printable forms and associated publications necessary to register and title your vehicle are pro- vided. It should be noted that you will need to complete each respective form and print it since it cannot be saved on the website.

As noted on the SAN website, the titling and registering information was obtained from state resources and is current as of July 1, 2011 and is also subject to change. In addition, the website emphasizes that you should always consult your current state statutes and regulations for accuracy purposes.

I hope this resource will be beneficial to you in obtaining information regarding the titling and registering of your antique vehicles.
