

I do believe.


Thy perfume swells the breeze,



March 15, 1917

MAY DIG ALASKA LIGNITE DEPOSITS

According to John A. Davis, superintendent of the Fairbanks station of the United States bureau of mines, who arrived here this week, the first work to be undertaken by the Fairbanks station will be the problem of treating the coal in the Nenana district so that it will be fit for practical use.

There are approximately ten billion tons of lignite in the Healy and Lignite creeks regions which has yet to be mined. This will have to be removed before the coal is fit for commercial use.




