



For 1968, I have F 99 & F 999. For 1970, I have F22 with every sticker thru 1975 scattered all over it, and I have F 98 with no stickers. In 1976, the Farm license plate format changed to FA suffix with FARM written across bottom. 1976 have pair 2828 FA.

Some of my fondest memories as a kid are spending time on my friend's dairy farms in upstate New York. One of my fondest memories of my mom is baking apple pies with apples I helped pick during fall harvest time. I am greatly saddened by state of farmers today with mega farms being paid \$\$\$ billions for not growing crops, while small farmers struggle. My deceased wife Barb came from a farm family. 


Potluck or private meal: we'll cook brats & have buns, mustard, kraut and set up pot luck. If you're concerned about shared food, bring a box lunch!
