


#### **President's Headlights**

### **CLUB PICTURE PROJECT and SAM'S SOURDOUGH CAFE**

Opening in 1987, Sam's Sourdough Cafe became a Fairbanks dining landmark for locals and visitors. The restaurant was awarded "..one of the top breakfast spots in the United States..." and was famous for its sourdough starter.

On March 14, 2009, the restaurant had a fire that completely destroyed the building and its contents with the exception of some rescued sourdough starter. The eclectic collection of auto related pictures and magazine articles were lost forever.


A decision was made by the owners to rebuild the building and on February 7, 2010 the restaurant was reopened minus the unique collection of memorabilia that once decorated the old building.

In early 2010 the Vernon Nash Car Club approached Sharon Nault, owner of Sam's Sourdough and Kathryn Franklin, the cafe manager, with a proposal to help decorate the new restaurant. It was agreed that the club would use pictures of club members cars and that the club could decorate the back dining room at the club's discretion.

Club members were asked to submit pictures of their cars and \$20.00 per picture would be charged for frames, picture printing and mounting. The project was led by Gary Nash. Club president Rick Larrick was in charge of printing pictures with car identification information and the club's name on the face of the picture. John McCarthy was in charge of the frames. The parts and pieces were then prepared and assembled in Gary Nash's garage by Gary and John.

The first batch of pictures were presented to the membership for review and approval at the membership meeting in March 2010. A week later, Rick, Gary and John did the layout and picture hanging at the restaurant. Phase one of the project was complete. Two rows of club vehicle pictures wrapped the walls of the back dining room.

The project met with such an abundance of positive comments that more pictures were solicited from the club membership adding a third row of pictures to the dining room's walls. This completed Phase 2, the final phase, of the project.





FIRST PICTURES PRESENTED TO SAM'S SOURDOUGH

The first batch of car club pictures for the Sam's Sourdough Cafe project were displayed for membership viewing, in part, in the March VLNAACF newsletter and at the March 11th general membership meeting. The pictures came out excellent and show the diversification of our club vehicles that we own and like to drive. The 25 pictures in (Continued Page 2)

The Vernon Nash Car Club held several board meetings in the room and some membership meeting between 2010 and 2014. Our membership meeting attendance outgrew the room and forced the club to find a larger meeting space. The restaurant continued to receive positive comments about the clubs car pictures.

In 2021, pandemic concerns and a combination of family issues forced the permanent closing of the restaurant The building was put up for sale.

On December 28, 2022, Caroline Mustard received a phone call while working at the Fountainhead Auto Museum. The caller, Kim Sanders, accounting manager for Doyon Foundation stated that the Sam's Sourdough Cafe building had been sold and the club's car pictures were available, if the club wanted them. Caroline, familiar with the pictures and project, called John McCarthy. On December 29,2022, John went to Sam's Sourdough and removed the pictures.

The building is now owned by Doyon Foundation, a non-profit entity of Doyon Limited and will be remodeled into office and study space for Alaska indigenous language revitalization and scholarship for Doyon shareholders. There will be one corner of the building

reserved with a booth and table in remembrance of the famous Sam's sourdough starter that made the cafe a Fairbanks icon for over three decades.

The pictures have been secured at the club's storage facility. The board would like your help in determining the disposition of these pictures. 
### John McCarthy
